An Inspired Emo Toad Ami Design Pattern

It may be worth noting that this pattern was designed left-handed. This shouldn't have any effect on your results, but feel free to adjust your stitches to match any colour changes. Don't be afraid to add or subtract a stitch or two!

This pattern is intended for creators with previous experience crocheting amigurumi and does not include tutorials.

Tools and Materials

These are the tools and materials the designer used to achieve the results in the photos, but Gloomy Grizzly Bear can be made with many other hook sizes, yarn weights, and yarn colours.

- 3.0mm Tulip Etimo Hook
- Scissors, yarn needle, pins
- Stuffing (PolyFil)
- Worsted (#4) Yarn

R5 (sc6, inc) x8 (64) (Photo 2)

R6-R10 sc64 (5 Rounds) (Photo 3)

R11 (sc7, inc) x8 (72)

R12-R15 sc72 (4 Rounds) (Photo 4)

R16 (sc7, dec) x8 (64)

R17-R18 sc64 (2 Rounds)

R19 (sc6, dec) x8 (56)

R20 (sc5, dec) x8 (48)

R21 sc48 (48) (Photo 5)

R22 (sc6, dec) x6 (42)

R23 sc42 (42)

Begin in “White”

Stuff

R1 ch9

R2 sc8, continue around chain, sc8 (16)

R3 inc, sc6, (inc) x2, sc6, inc (20)

R4 sc, inc, sc7, inc, sc, inc, sc7, inc (24)

R5 sc2, inc, sc8, inc, sc2, inc, sc8, inc (28)

Change to “Dark Taupe”

R6 sc28 (28)

Blood (Make 1 in “Bright Red”)

ch10, turn, sk1st ch, sl

1st Blood Drip: ch5, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl3, sl in next st on foundation

2nd Blood Drip: ch5, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl3, sl3 in foundation

3rd Blood Drip: ch8, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl6, sl3 in foundation

4th Blood Drip: ch5, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl3 sl in foundation

FO leaving tail for sewing

(The 4sl create a bulbous end in the drips)

Ch8, turn, sc7, continue around foundation, sc7

Blood Spot (Make 1 in “Bright Red”)

R1 MR 6

R2 (inc) x6 (12)

R3 (hdc, dc, trc, dc, hdc), sl2, (hdc, dc, hdc), sl2, (hdc, dc, hdc) sl2, (sc, hdc, dc, trc, dc, hdc, sc) sl2

Leg (Make 2 in “Pink”)

Stuff

R1 MR 6

R2 (inc) x6 (12)

R3 (sc, Inc) x6 (18)

R4 (sc2, inc) x6 (24)

R5 (sc3, inc) x6 (30)

R6 BLO sc30 (30)

R7-R9 sc30 (3 Rounds)

R10 (sc3, dec) x6 (24)

R11-R18 sc24 (8 Rounds)

FO first leg, DO NOT FO 2nd leg, continue with the body (Photo 14)

R19 ch4, make next sc into side st on 1st leg, sc23, sc4 in ch4, sc24 on 2nd leg, sc4 in ch4 (56)

You will move your stitch marker to the last st you make on the ch. (Photo 15)

R20 sc56 (56)

R21 (sc5, dec) x8 (48)

R22 sc48 (48)

R23 (sc4, dec) x8 (40)

R24-R27 sc40 (4 Rounds) (Photo 16)

R28 (sc3, dec) x8 (32)

R29-R36 sc32 (8 Rounds)

R37 (sc14, dec) x2 (30)

Arms (Make 2 in “Pink”)

Lightly Stuff $\frac{3}{4}$ of the Arms

R1 MR 6

R2 (inc) x6 (12)

R3 (sc, inc) x6 (18)

R4 (sc2, inc) x6 (24)

R5-R8 sc24 (4 Rounds) (Photo)

R9 (sc10, dec) x2 (22)

R10-R11 sc22 (2 Rounds)

R12 (sc9, dec) x2 (20)

R13 sc20 (20)

R14 (sc8, dec) x2 (18)

R15 sc18 (18)

R16 (sc7, dec) x2 (16)

R17-R18 sc16 (2 Rounds)

R19 (sc6, dec) x2 (14)

R20-R23 sc14 (4 Rounds)

R24 (sc5, dec) x2 (12) (Photo 18)

Fingers (Make 6 in “Bright Red” and “White”)

Begin in “Bright Red”

R1 MR 4

R2 sc4 (4)

R3 (sc, inc) x2 (6)

Change to “White”

R4-R6 sc6 (3 Rounds) (Photo 19)

FO leaving tail for sewing

Assembly

1. Using a strand of “Dark Taupe”, embroider the nose over the 4 middle st between R1 & R2. (Photo 20) Sew snout to head centered between R4 & R11.. (Photo 21)
2. Sew blood drips centered directly around the bottom of the snout. (Photo 22)
3. Sew the eyes 2 st away from either side of the snout. They should match up with the same rounds as the top and bottom of the snout. (Photo 23)
4. Using a strand of “Dark Taupe”, backstitch twice over R3 to R9. Sew the ears on the top of the head, 4 Rounds from the close to 10 Rounds from the close. Squeeze the ear flat and allow it to curve naturally when sewing. (Photo 24 & 25)
5. Sew the body to the head at R5. It should be sewn in an oval shape instead of circle. It will be 1 round from where the blood drips are sewn. (Photo 26)

- 6. Sew the fingers to the end of the arms. (Photo 27)
- 7. Sew the arms to the body 2 rounds below the join. (Photo 28 & 29)
- 8. Sew the blood patch to the body. (Photo 30)

- R2 sc8, continue around chain, sc8 (16)
- R3 inc, sc6, (inc) x2, sc6, inc (20)
- R4 sc, inc, sc7, inc, sc, inc, sc7, inc (24)
- R5 sc2, inc, sc8, inc, sc2, inc, sc8, inc (28)
- Change to “Dark Taupe”
- R6 sc28 (28)
- FO leaving tail for sewing (Photo 8)

Ears (Make 2 in “Pink”)

- R1 MR 6
- R2 (inc) x6 (12)
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- R5-R6 sc24 (2 Rounds)
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- FO leaving tail for sewing (Photo 9)

Blood (Make 1 in “Bright Red”)

ch10, turn, sk1st ch, sl

1st Blood Drip: ch5, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl3, sl in next st on foundation

2nd Blood Drip: ch5, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl3, sl3 in foundation

3rd Blood Drip: ch8, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl6, sl3 in foundation

4th Blood Drip: ch5, turn, sk1st ch, 4sl, sl3 sl in foundation

FO leaving tail for sewing

(The 4sl create a bulbous end in the drips)

Ch8, turn, sc7, continue around foundation, sc7 (14)
